- **Faculty Development Workshop**

A Faculty Development Workshop on the ‘Revolutionary Potential of Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SOTL)’ was organized by Economics Department on March 27, 2017 in collaboration with UFV Canada. The Resource person was Dr. Eric Davis, Provost and Vice President Academic University of Fraser Valley, Canada. He was accompanied by Dr. Satwinder Bains, Director Centre for Indo-Canadian Studies, Director of Fraser Valley Canada and Mr. Aditya Akre, Administrator at University of Fraser Valley Campus, Chandigarh. Dr. Davis was of the view point that a paradigm shift is taking place all over the world and the teacher centric learning is undergoing a change to learner



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centric learning. In learning paradigm, the learning is co-operative, collaborative and inter-disciplinary. Massive change is happening in the universities and colleges. Accountability and Quality Assurance are the benchmarks of the learning paradigm. The 21st century is moving towards student learning strategies. He suggested that self-directed, self-paced and work integrated learning is essential for the survival of higher learning. This was followed by an interactive session with the students.
