The Nature of Women

What is meant by a woman’s intuitive perception? It denotes a quick and accurate perception of current events. It has nothing to do with general principles. Nobody has ever arrived at a general rule of duty or prudence through intuitions, let alone a scientific law of nature. There are results of slow and careful collection and comparison of experience, and neither men nor women of intuition usually shine in this department, unless the experience required is one that they... can acquire on their own. For their intuitive sagacity makes them particularly adept at gathering such general truths as can be gleaned from their individual means of observation. When, as a result, they have the same chance as men do to be well provided with the results of other people’s experience, by reading and education (I use the word chance carefully, because, in respect to the knowledge that tends to fit them for the greater concerns of life, the only educated women are the self-educated), they are better furnished than men in general with the essential requisites of skilful and successful practice.

This is rarely the case for women of any ability with equal experience and general faculties, a woman usually sees much more of what is immediately in front of her than a man. Now, this sensitivity to the present is the primary quality on which capacity for practice, as derived from theory, is based. Discovering general principles is speculative faculty; discerning and discriminating the specific cases in which they are and are not applicable is practical talent, and women as they are now have a unique aptitude for this. Admit that there can be no good practice without principles, and that the predominance of quickness of observation among a woman’s faculties makes her especially prone to making hasty generalizations based on her own observation.

Despite the fact that her observation spans a broader range, she is no Lesage to correct those generalizations. However, the remedy for this flaw is access to the collective experience of the human race, which is precisely the kind of general knowledge that education can best provide. A woman’s errors are specifically those of a clever self-educated man, who frequently sees what men trained in routine do not see but falls into errors due to a lack of knowledge of things that have long been known. Of course, he must have acquired much of the pre-existing knowledge, or he would not have progressed; but what he knows of it he has picked up in fragments and at random, as women do.


