

#### 1. SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

Solid Waste Management is done in the college by placing garbage bins at different corners throughout the campus for the collection of regular solid waste products. Garbage bins are kept in all the classrooms, labs, auditorium and various other departments to collect waste. The entire campus is very neat and clean, and we endeavour to have a plastic-free campus. Blue and green dustbins are placed across the campus to segregate the waste as degradable and non-degradable waste. Sanitary napkin incinerators are installed in washrooms that help in disposing off the napkins in an environment-friendly method by burning the pads and converting them into ash. The college also has a wastepaper recycling unit where the wastepaper from the entire college is recycled into new paper products.




## Clean India Campaign by NCC


