The Himachal Pradesh University's Youth Festival for the year 2021-22 commenced on September 19 at Rajkiya Kanya Mahavidyalaya, Longwood, Shimla. The festival was inaugurated by the Vice-Chancellor of Himachal Pradesh Central University, Dharamshala, Sh. SP Bansal. A total of 422 participants from 53 colleges were registered for Group 1, which focused on 'Creativity'. St. Bede's College was among the participating institutions. On the opening day of the festival, competitions such as Quiz, Elocution, and Cartoon making competitions were held. 
