SESSION 2017-18

STATE-LEVEL EVENT

On August 28, 2017, a state-level event was organized at the Gaiety Theatre in Shimla by the Himachal Pradesh State AIDS Control Society to celebrate International Youth Day.

Objective: The event aimed to raise awareness about AIDS and promote measures to prevent its spread.

WORKSHOP ON HIV/AIDS

SESSION 2018-19

DECLAMATION CONTEST

On 30th August 2018, our club organized a declamation contest focusing on two critical topics: "Safe Spaces for Youth" and "Importance of HIV Testing."

Objective: The primary objective of the declamation contest was to encourage participants to engage in public speaking and express their thoughts on the importance of safe spaces for youth and the significance of HIV testing. By providing a platform for discussion and dialogue, the event sought to educate and empower young individuals to take responsibility for their well-being and make informed decisions about their health and safety.

The declamation contest took place in the auditorium of our club premises, starting at 10:00 AM. Students and young individuals from various educational institutions and communities participated in the event. The contest was divided into two categories: "Safe Spaces for Youth" and "Importance of HIV Testing," allowing participants to choose their preferred topic based on their interests and knowledge.

The event began with an opening address by the club president, emphasizing the significance of the chosen topics and encouraging participants to voice their opinions and insights. They addressed the misconceptions surrounding HIV/AIDS and emphasized the need for regular testing, responsible sexual behaviour, and de-stigmatization of individuals living with the virus.

Outcome: The declamation contest proved to be a successful event, achieving its objectives of raising awareness and fostering dialogue on the topics of safe spaces for youth and the importance of HIV testing. The participants delivered compelling speeches, demonstrating their knowledge, research, and public speaking skills. The audience, comprising students, educators, and community members, actively engaged in the discussions, creating a positive and constructive atmosphere.

Through this event, young individuals gained a deeper understanding of the need for safe spaces in their personal lives and the wider community. They also acquired valuable knowledge about HIV prevention and the importance of testing for early diagnosis. AWARENESS TRAINING SESSION

On 21st November 2018, three students from our club had the privilege of attending an awareness training session organized by the Red Ribbon Committee of Himachal Pradesh. The session took place at Deen Dayal Upadhyay Government Hospital in Shimla.

Objective: The objective of this training was to educate the students about the common problems faced by individuals living with HIV.

The training session began with an introduction to the Red Ribbon Committee and its role in promoting awareness and support for people affected by HIV/AIDS. The trainers provided an overview of the HIV virus, its modes of transmission, and the current statistics regarding the prevalence of HIV in the region. SESSION 2019-20

Additionally, a rally on AIDS awareness was organized, in which NSS and NCC volunteers actively participated. Muskan Chauhan, a student from our college, secured the 3rd prize in the poster making competition.

The state-level function on World AIDS Day took place at Hotel Peterhoff in Shimla. The event brought together the Red Ribbon Club, NSS, and NCC units to create a collective effort in raising awareness and combating HIV/AIDS.



Competitions:

- 1. Nukkad Natak (Street Play): The Nukkad Natak competition allowed students to showcase their acting and storytelling skills. SESSION 2020-21

SESSION 2021-22

WORLD AIDS DAY

On 1st December 2021, the Club commemorated World AIDS Day by organizing a declamation contest and poster making competition centered around the theme of "Resilience."

Objective: The objective of these events was to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS, highlight the resilience of individuals living with the virus, and promote a supportive and empathetic society.

The World AIDS Day commemoration started with the declamation contest, where participants had the opportunity to deliver powerful speeches on the theme of "Resilience." SEMINAR PRESENTED BY AN ICTC (INTEGRATED COUNSELING AND **TESTING CENTRE**)

On 6th March 2021, students from the club attended a seminar presented by an ICTC (Integrated Counselling and Testing Centre) Counsellor at Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital in Shimla. The seminar, presided over by Dr. Ashok Chauhan (DAPO), aimed to raise awareness among the youth about HIV/AIDS and its prevention.

Objective: The focus of the seminar was to highlight the importance of the younger generation in playing a responsible role in combating HIV-related stigma and discrimination towards PLHIV (Patients Living with Human Immunodeficiency Virus).

The seminar took place in the auditorium of Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital and commenced with an introduction by Dr. Ashok Chauhan, emphasizing the significance of the youth's involvement in the prevention and awareness of HIV/AIDS. The ICTC Counsellor then conducted a comprehensive presentation, covering various aspects related to HIV/AIDS, including transmission, prevention, testing, and the impact of stigma and discrimination on PLHIV.

The seminar focused on educating the attendees about the modes of transmission of HIV, emphasizing the importance of practicing safe sex, using condoms, and avoiding risky





behaviours such as sharing needles. The ICTC Counsellor provided accurate information regarding HIV testing and the benefits of early diagnosis, stressing the significance of regular testing for sexually active individuals.

Moreover, the seminar shed light on the existing stigma and discrimination faced by PLHIV in society. It highlighted the negative consequences of such attitudes and behaviours, including hindered access to healthcare, reduced social support, and psychological impact. The attendees were encouraged to reflect upon their own perceptions and biases and to take proactive measures to combat stigma and discrimination.

The session included interactive discussions, allowing students to ask questions, seek clarification, and share their thoughts on HIV/AIDS awareness and prevention. The ICTC Counsellor provided practical strategies and suggestions for the youth to actively contribute towards reducing stigma and discrimination, emphasizing the importance of empathy, education, and spreading accurate information within their communities.

Outcome: The seminar raised awareness about the stigma and discrimination faced by PLHIV, stimulating empathy and a sense of responsibility among the participants. The interactive discussions fostered a supportive and inclusive environment, empowering the students to actively challenge and combat HIV-related stigma within their communities.

COMMEMORATING 75 YEARS OF PROGRESSIVE INDIA

To celebrate and commemorate 75 years of progressive India, the Red Ribbon Club of St. Bede's College actively participated in the 2nd phase of the New India @75 Campaign, under the government initiative 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'.

Objective: The club organized various competitions with the aim of spreading awareness and promoting social causes related to health and well-being. The competitions organized under this campaign were as follows:

- a) Seminar on HIV: The Red Ribbon Club conducted a seminar on HIV awareness, focusing on educating participants about the prevention, transmission, and treatment of HIV/AIDS. The seminar aimed to dispel myths and misconceptions surrounding HIV and promote a better understanding of the disease.
- b) Extempore on Blood Donation: An extempore competition was organized to highlight the importance of blood donation and to encourage participants to share their thoughts and perspectives on this noble act. The competition aimed to raise awareness about the need for regular blood donations and the impact it has on saving lives.
- c) One-minute short video on TB: The Red Ribbon Club organized a competition where participants were tasked with creating a one-minute short video on the theme of tuberculosis (TB). - d) Nukkad Natak on blood donation: The Red Ribbon Club organized a nukkad natak (street

ONE DAY TRAINING PROGRAM OF RRC'S MEMBERS




Through these intra-college activities, the Red Ribbon Club volunteers actively engaged in spreading awareness about HIV prevention and addressing the challenges associated with the
