

1. Restricted Entry of Automobiles




Restricted Entry of Automobiles




2. Pedestrian Friendly Pathways




4. Landscaping with Trees and Plants



Field Visit to CPRI

On August 25, 2022, B.Sc. (Hons.) Biotechnology, Microbiology, B.Sc. Medical and Non-medical 3rd year students visited Central Potato Research Institute (CPRI) in Shimla for a field trip. The students were educated about various techniques such as Plant Tissue Culture, Aeroponics, Hydroponics, and Seed Technology. In addition, they were introduced to different potato varieties that were grown in the labs. The students received an introduction about the history, objectives, and contribution of the organization from an eminent scientist. They then visited the institute's extensive library, which is the second largest in Asia and contains abundant literature on potatoes. After that, the students were shown various tools and instruments used in potato crop development and plant tissue culture experiments. The highlight of the visit was the Electron microscope, and the technical staff explained its structure and function to the students. Next, the students visited the tissue culture lab, where the process was explained to them.

Plastic bags, empty chip packets, and soft drink bottles are all contributing to the accumulation of garbage in the environment, which is causing various problems.

• Cleanliness Drive

On October 7, 2022, the Environment Cell and Disaster Management Cell of St. Bede's College Shimla, in collaboration with Shimla Municipal Corporation, organized a cleanliness drive named "Saf Ho Sundar Ho, AisaMera Bharat Ho" from Navbahar Chowk to The Secretariat in Shimla to emphasize the importance of cleanliness in society. The drive began at 11 a.m. and lasted until 2 p.m., during which over 70 students and four teachers actively participated.

The students handpicked plastic bottles and empty packets from the roads and packed them into garbage bags provided by the Shimla MC. The authorities had granted permission for the cleanliness drive beforehand, and the MC also provided masks, gloves, and a garbage truck for the initiative. The cleanliness drive not only contributed to the immediate cleanliness of the designated area but also aimed to create awareness among the participants and the public about the importance of maintaining cleanliness in their daily lives.

The interactive session with the students provided a great opportunity for them to learn about wildlife conservation. • Field visit to Western Himalayan Temperate Arboretum, Potter's Hill

On October 20, 2022, a field trip to Potters Hill Nature Park was arranged for MSc. I and III semester students. The group of 35 students had a goal to discover the Western Himalayan flora. The purpose of the trip was to gain knowledge about various flora present in Himachal Pradesh, their cultivation techniques, and uses. The host who guided the group provided detailed explanations about different higher altitude plants and their uses. The students were introduced to various plants that are not typically cultivated in Himachal Pradesh, such as Ginkgo biloba, as well as plants found at higher altitudes in HP, such as Betula utilis. The students gained a lot of information about various aspects of Western Himalayan flora during the visit. Overall, the trip was informative and successful for the students.

• Local Field Visit to the Directorate of Horticulture

The Department of Botany organized a field trip on December 22, 2022, for both PG and UG students to visit the Department of Horticulture in Navbahar, Shimla. The objective of the trip was to observe various species of flowering plants and to learn about their value-added products. The department's scientists delivered an informative talk on floriculture, followed by an interactive session with the students. The students then visited the nurseries and greenhouses, where they observed a vast collection of flowering and medicinal plants such as Magnolia, Vinca major, Thuja, Asparagus, Tradescantia, Daisy (Asteraceae), Strelitzia (Bird of Paradise), Geranium, Utricularia, Rumex obtusifolius (Bitter dock), and Smilax. The experience was insightful and interesting for the Botany students, who gained knowledge about floriculture and value-added products from plants.


