



























Students Feedback on Curriculum

2020-2021

- The college has inculcated a practice of collecting feedback from different stakeholders on offered curriculum over the years. During academic session 2020-2021when teaching-learning process got impeded due to pandemic, this feedback collection became even more relevant to successfully cater to the needs of the students and offer them best learning experience through online teaching mode. The feedback included issues related to satisfaction regarding the following pointers-
- Structured, comprehensive and relevant curriculum which balances theory and its application.
- Internships, Student Exchange and Field visit opportunities.
- Development of soft skills, life skills and employability skills.
- Development of analytical and problem-solving skills.
- Relevance to real life situations, current trends and practices in the respective disciplines.
- Adequate balance between studies and social life.
- Timely completion of syllabus.
- Availability of sufficient reference material and books.
- Transparency in evaluation methods for overall assessment.
- Usage of e-content and ICT for enhanced learning experience.
- The feedback was collected through online mode and the analysis of the information gathered is as follows:
- According to the general response of the students, the curriculum is well structured, relevant
 with clear aims and objectives.
- But the offered curriculum does not promote internships, student exchange programs and many field visit opportunities due to which students do not get hands on training and lack practical knowledge about the course.
- The course does improve the soft skills of the students to a certain extent, but life skills and
 employability skills are not inculcated in the students, which prepare them to take up
 challenges in the workplace. They lack managerial skills, an analytical, problem-solving
 approach and technical skills which result in incompetency.
- The students believe that their course is relevant to the current times and provides them with
 the opportunity to engage with community programs. The designed curriculum thus maintains
 a balance between studies and their societal execution.
- However, the syllabus is lengthy for some courses which make it difficult for students and
 teachers to complete the entire syllabus in assigned number of lectures. Often extra classes are
 conducted to cover the syllabus thus there is a definite need for revision and reduction of the
 lengthy syllabi. Books for some of the courses are also not easily available which further
 makes it difficult for students to study and single handedly rely on teachers' notes. Hence,



- reference books and relevant reading material should be made available in accordance with the designed syllabus.
- According to the generalized view, set parameters for internal assessment also requires certain changes. The assessment criteria should be made more inclusive, transparent and exclude attendance marks.
- The teaching-learning process entirely shifted to online mode during covid times, but this process took some time for execution. MS-Teams, PPT's, online videos were used for the teaching-learning process, but students took some time to get acquainted to online mode of learning.
