
Inter Ship Debate Competition Date: September 27, 2023

Inter Ship Book Review Competition


Date:October 4, 2023

Inter Ship Photography and Essay Writing Competition


Date: October 11, 2023

Date: October 12, 2023



Date : December 11, 2023


Objective: To promote and celebrate the linguistic diversity of India and to foster National unity and integration among the students by representing their different cultures through their attires.
