
ADVANCED AND SLOW LEARNERS

3. Additional Support:

Offer supplementary tutoring sessions focusing on foundational skills, study strategies, and homework assistance. Arrange for peer tutoring and group study sessions to encourage collaborative learning and peer support.

4. Regular Monitoring and Feedback:


Conduct regular progress monitoring to assess improvements and provide constructive feedback to learners, emphasizing growth and areas of improvement rather than just performance metrics.

5. Parental and Guardian Involvement:

Keep parents or guardians informed about their child's progress and involve them in decision-making processes during PTM. Offer guidance on how they can support their child's learning at home.

Slow Learners and Advanced Learners Program Report 2023-24

In the academic year 2023-24, the Department of English identified both slow and advanced learners after about two months of teaching.

For slow learners, remedial classes were held regularly to provide extra support. These students were encouraged to work harder, given memory tips, and provided with additional questions to foster better study habits. Dedicated sessions in the language lab helped them improve their communication skills. They also received regular assignments and tests to enhance their learning abilities and writing skills. Individualized guidance was then offered based on the evaluation of these assessments to help them improve further.

Advanced learners were encouraged to demonstrate their skills by writing and presenting papers in class. They were encouraged to explore advanced literature to deepen their knowledge. Additionally, they were motivated to participate in inter-college activities and competitions to apply their skills practically. Teachers also encouraged their involvement in the editorial boards of the college magazine and department newsletter, providing platforms for them to showcase their talents and contribute to academic discussions.

These interventions aimed to meet the diverse learning needs of all students, ensuring both slow and advanced learners received the necessary support and opportunities for growth.





Khyati Lashty: Despite initial challenges in specific areas, the student participated in remedial classes. The impact of these sessions is still being evaluated, and adjustments may be needed to optimize the student's learning experience.

Megha Mahajan: Regular remedial classes were organized for the student. She attended classes regularly and her performance improved eventually.

Nikita Bhardwaj: Remedial classes resulted in improved understanding, leading to Nikita's consistent attendance and academic progress.

Department of Biotechnology Remedial Classroom Reports

- The students who scored below 50% in their internal exams were given extra remedial classes, the purpose of which was to identify student weaknesses and provide them with the necessary aid and guidance to help them overcome their problems.
- Remedial teaching strategies involved using one to one teaching of students experiencing problems in specific subject areas.
- Step by step instructions without skipping material is provided at the student's pace.
- Different strategies such as video demonstrations, picture depiction etc. are used to make the concept much more comprehensive to the students.
- Evaluating whether the student has understood the concept through oral tests is ensured before moving on to the next topic.
- Students with poor laboratory skills are given extra hands-on sessions in free hours to improve their technical skills.
- Routine assessment through live laboratory sessions, assignments, power point presentations and written tests is done to assess her knowledge about the particular topic.
- They are given topics from the syllabus and motivated to explain them in front of the entire class.
- Their peers with better learning abilities are asked to help them in clearing their doubts and help them through cooperative learning.

APPLE VISION PRO

Apple vision pro is a revolutionary headset developed by Apple Inc. It was announced on June 5, 2023, at Apple's Worldwide Developers Conference, and pre-order began on January 19, 2024. It became available for purchase on February 2, 2024, in the United States. A worldwide launch has yet to be announced. Apple Vision Pro is Apple's first new major product category since the release of the Apple Watch in 2015.

Apple markets Apple Vision Pro as a "Spatial computer" where digital content is integrated with the real world. Physical objects—such as books, papers, art, and music—can be viewed as if they were in front of the user. Apple has marketed the device as a virtual reality headset when discussing the product in press releases and marketing. The device runs vision OS, a virtual reality operating system derived from iOS. Systemwide, vision OS 1.0 introduces a new user interface, including the ability to interact with the user's surroundings, as well as content that can be viewed in 3D.

The OS supports several features called "apps" which are presented for viewing. The user's face is shown on the front of the headset through a rendering of the user's face ("FaceTime"), which are used to indicate the user's level of interaction. In addition, the user can interact with the environment.

Developed by Apple, Apple Vision Pro is the result of decades of research, including artificial intelligence, machine, and wearable devices — combining in the most advanced product Apple has ever created. Apple Vision Pro combines incredibly advanced technology like an ultra-high-resolution laser projectors to an external processor away from the device.

A decentralized network of computers is used to verify and process transactions, eliminating the need for traditionally used intermediaries - banks.

There are a number of positive impacts of crypto on traditional banking practices, like, making them faster, more secure, and more efficient. Owing to its decentralized nature and no intermediaries, the transactions become cheaper, leading to cost cutting. In addition to this, since it is not subject to any government control, it enhances the demand of investment in those regions where it was earlier not possible, leading to economic growth of such regions. It is also an attractive option for international transaction as no



Though its advantages are abundant, there are some of its negative impacts on the traditional banking system as well. Firstly, due to the intense volatility of the digital currencies, it becomes an unreliable store of value. Since the price fluctuations are so unpredictable, it becomes difficult for investors to accurately predict their returns while investing. Secondly, since it is decentralized, it faces issues related to security. It is vulnerable to hacking and hence less secure as compared to other centralized banking programs. Thirdly, since it is free from government control, any fraud faced by any individual is not subject to strict legal action.

In conclusion, it would be interesting to see if traditional banks adopt and incorporate cryptocurrency into their existing models.
