Objective: The objective of the campaign is to make students aware of the Menace of Ragging and to create a commitment from the students to say no to the ragging.


Ragging includes any conduct that has the effect of teasing, treating, or handling a student with rudeness, or indulging in indiscipline activities that cause annoyance, hardship, or psychological harm. It can also include physical abuse, mental abuse, or infringement of fundamental human rights therefore on 12th August 2024 the Anti-Ragging Committee of St. Bede's College started the Anti-Ragging Week celebration with the Anti-Ragging signature campaign to spread awareness among students about the importance of anti-ragging. The committee put up a chart outside the auditorium which was easily accessible to all the students and the students were encouraged to come up and sign on the chart and become a part of this campaign.

Outcome: Conducting this campaign at the college level has made students understand the ragging and its consequences and inculcate moral values and ethics by showing their commitment through signature for saying no to ragging.

















Event: A Talk on 'Prevention of Ragging in Higher Institutions' to observe Anti-Ragging Week


Date: August 13, 2024

Objective: The activity plays an important role in making students aware of their legal rights and the different acts passed by the government for the safety of Ragging.

The Anti-Ragging Cell of St. Bede's College organized a talk on 'Prevention of Ragging in Higher Institutions' to observe Anti-Ragging Week in which Sh. Anup Kumar Rattan Ji, Advocate General of Himachal Pradesh was invited as the guest speaker. He was accompanied by Sh. Sushant Keprate Ji, Additional Advocate General, Himachal Pradesh.

The Principal of St. Bede's College Prof (Sr.) Molly Abraham was the chief patron of the event which was convened by Dr Vishal Chauhan, Department of Economics and Members- Dr Jyotika Brari (Zoology) and Ms Komal Sharma (Political Science Department). The Chief guest acquainted students with the evil of ragging and its impact on the lives of students. He informed students about the legal provisions and the difference between interaction and ragging. The event ended with a pledge and left a major impression on the students and faculty.

Outcome: The lecture enhances the knowledge of the students about the ragging and makes them aware of different laws and the authorities to visit at the time of the incident. Students learned about their freedom and about their constitutional rights.
