11. Significant contributions made by IQAC during the current year (maximum five bullets)

• IQAC initiated for the research funding from various agencies. The college was awarded the "CURIE Core Grant for Women PG Colleges" and funding through the DBT Star College Scheme, strengthening its science departments. Various events were organised under the aegis of IQAC: Disaster preparedness training, self-defense workshops for girls, and an E-Waste Collection Drive, showcasing a commitment to social responsibility and environmental stewardship. • To support professional growth various Faculty Development Program, Capacity

building programs were organised under the aegis of IQAC, the Department of Computer Science hosted a five-day Faculty Development Programme on "Academic Writing and Research Methodology," while the Commerce & Management Department organized capacity-building programs with IBS, ICFAI Business School. Additionally, a Financial Lab session promoted women entrepreneurship in partnership with SkillLabs, and Ms. Satwinder Bains from the University of Fraser Valley, Canada, provided insights on international education opportunities. • Under the guidance of IQAC, college organized several impactful international workshops and webinars, promoting physical, mental, and academic well-being. Highlights included a three-day national workshop on Yoga for a Healthy Lifestyle. Additionally, an international workshop was held on the topic Let's Move on the occassion of International Olympic Day. • The Health Club collaborated with the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports for a webinar on holistic well-being through traditional medicine and yoga. The Department of Physical Education organised a National Webinar under the aegis of 'Viksit Bharat@2047' on Health and Injuries in Sports. The speaker for the session was Dr. L. Santosh from Manipur University. The Department of Botany celebrated International Women's Day by organising an International Webinar on "Contribution of Women in STEM Fields" for postgraduate students. Dr. Oliver B. Villaflores from the University of Santo Tomas, Philippines, and Dr. Satish Sharma, Professor and Head of the Department of Electronics and Computer Science at RTM Nagpur University, were the resource persons for the event. These initiatives supported health awareness, STEM empowerment, and interdisciplinary knowledge exchange. • IQAC strengthened academic partnerships, signing MOUs with organizations like Communications Manufacturing Applications Infrastructure-Association of India (CMAI), Sophia College, and Technoledge Eduresearch, expanding student learning opportunities with add-on courses in areas such as Digital Marketing, Web Designing, Advance Excel, and Python Programming. • A comprehensive academic and administrative audit was conducted by IQAC to evaluate institutional performance and effectiveness. Feedback from stakeholders was actively gathered to identify strengths and areas for improvement, ensuring that the college continues to meet high standards and align with the needs of its community. • Furthermore, the college achieved an 'A' grade with a CGPA of 3.1 in NAAC's fourth cycle of accreditation, reflecting its commitment to quality education and continuous improvement.

Self-defense training sessions conducted	On October 10th, 2023, the Women Cell under the aegis of IQAC, organized a Self Defense Training session for girls, focusing on building confidence and strength. The training empowered participants with practical self-defense skills and boosted their confidence, enhancing their ability to protect themselves in various situations.
Awareness exercise on Disaster Risk Mitigation and Preparedness organized:	Disaster Management Cell under the aegis of IQAC organized a Mock Drill on Mitigating Disaster Risk under the theme "Yuva Manthan Model G20" on August 05, 2023. A team from The Third Battalion Home guard Forces was invited to the event to demonstrate how to respond towards any disaster. They taught how to use first - aid and evacuate people during the disaster. The drill was demonstrated to 500 students, teaching and non-teaching staff of the college. The students were taught different techniques of evacuation and they learned how to use fire extinguishers, types of fire, types of fire extinguishers, disasters, injuries and evacuation.
Environment related activities organized	E-waste management activity was organised under the aegis of IQAC to raise awareness among students about the importance of proper electronic waste disposal for environmental protection. Electronic waste, including items like wires, chargers, TVs, kettles, headphones, batteries,

and mobile phones, is a major environmental pollutant often improperly discarded with household garbage. To address this, the State Pollution Control Board organized an ewaste awareness drive from October 16th to 21st, 2023. Contributing to this effort, St. Bede's College's Environment Cell held an E-Waste Collection Drive from October 14th to 18th, 2023, with a collection box for old electronic items. On October 18th, the collected e-waste was deposited to the State Pollution Control Board.

Preparing Program and Course
Outcomes with their attainment
level

On September 28th, an online training session organised by IQAC regarding the attainment and mapping of program outcomes and course outcomes. Dr. Surya Rashmi from the Central University, Dharamshala served as the resource person. The determination of final course outcome (CO) attainment involves a combination of direct and indirect assessment methods with an 80:20 ratio. These methods aid in mapping and setting benchmarks to recognize the attained levels of program and course outcomes across various disciplines. Disparities between achieved program outcomes and target values were identified, and respective academic disciplines formulated improvement strategies. These strategies aim to achieve both program outcomes (POs) and course outcomes (COs). Through this process, the college ensures the attainment of both

	POs and COs. Each department has mapped COs to POs and developed strategies to address gaps for improvement.
Innovative Ecosystem created	The Fine Arts Society, under the aegis of IQAC, organized an 'Art Exhibition' on February 22, 2024, fostering entrepreneurial skills among students. The event featured three main sections: the display section, where students showcased their artistic talents; the selling section, which provided students with a platform to retail their handmade creations, offering them real-world business experience; and the recycle waste activity section, promoting creativity and sustainability. Through this initiative, students not only honed their artistic abilities but also developed key entrepreneurial competencies such as marketing, customer engagement, and resource management.
Enhancement of Entrepreneurship skills by conducting Placement drives	• A quiz on "Future Business Sharks 2.0" was organised on September 22, 2023 by the Commerce and Management department under the aegis of IQAC to highlight the importance of new business ideas in nurturing entrepreneurship skills among students. • The Placement and Career Guidance Cell under the aegis of IQAC organized an Industry Connect Session for all students on November 7, 2023, with Mr. Sanjeev Sharma as the resource person. The session provided

students with valuable insights into industry trends and career opportunities, enhancing their readiness for the job market. • The Department of Sciences under the aegis of IQAC organized a career counseling session on November 23, 2023, with Dr. Vikas Mangal, a scientist at CPRI Shimla, as the resource person. He enlightened students on recent developments in molecular breeding and genetic engineering and their societal benefits. • On March 7, 2024, the Placement and Career Guidance Cell under the aegis of IQAC, in collaboration with Technoledge Edu Research Pvt. Ltd., conducted an online placement drive for Make Visions Outsourcing Pvt. Ltd. Fifteen students from various streams applied, and nine candidates were interviewed for the HR position. • On March 14, 2024, the Placement and Career Guidance Cell, under the aegis of IQAC, in collaboration with Arvind Fashions, successfully organized an Internship and Placement Drive. The event resulted in the selection of four students for the ASM Trainee position in the fashion industry, while three students secured internship opportunities. • On March 19, 2024, the Placement and Career Guidance Cell, under the aegis of IQAC, organized the statelevel Career Carnival-2024, welcoming aspiring students from across Himachal Pradesh. The event featured participation from eight reputed companies:

The IBSAT mock test, a one-hour offline exam for third-year students, saw participation from students across various departments who used the opportunity to assess and improve their performance for the actual examination. • Additionally, the Placement and Career Guidance Cell under the aegis of IQAC, in collaboration with Raj Malhotra IAS Study Hub, held a quiz competition and career guidance session on December 12, 2023. ● On February 14, 2024, the Financial Lab cum Incubation Centre which is a SkillLabs Resource Services Pvt. Ltd. under the aegis of IQAC, in collaboration with SkillLabs, organized an Awareness Session on Women Entrepreneurship for B.Com and BBA students. Dr. Himesh Sharma, CEO of SkillLabs, was the resource person for the session, emphasizing the importance of increasing female participation in the entrepreneurial ecosystem. • On

February 20, 2024, Ms. Satwinder Bains, Director of the University of Fraser Valley (UFV), Canada, delivered an enlightening lecture. She highlighted the diverse courses and curriculum offered at UFV. • On February 23, 2024, the Department of Computer Science at St. Bede's College organized a talk on "Cyber Security and Awareness" for faculty and students. Mr. Mohit Chawla, DIG Cyber Crime, Himachal Pradesh served as the resource person, discussing potential cyber threats and strategies for addressing them.

15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

St. Bede's College aligns with the vision of the NEP 2020, promoting holistic and multidisciplinary education. The college has implemented the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), allowing students to choose subjects from various streams. This approach encourages exploration of interests and development of competencies in multiple domains. To support the implementation of NEP 2020, Academic council facilitates discussions among faculty members. Regular Faculty development programs and orientation/training sessions enhance their understanding of the new curriculum and pedagogical reforms. The college has modern infrastructure, well-furnished classrooms, and advanced teaching resources which support blended teaching-learning, supported by a learning management system (MS-Teams). The curriculum integrates internships, sports, and extracurricular activities through Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA), cultivating social responsibility and nurturing connections among students. While full implementation of NEP 2020 awaits college affiliation with HPU, St. Bede's College is prepared to embrace its transformative vision. The college has established a Centre of Excellence for Multidisciplinary Research, promoting interdisciplinary collaboration and cutting-edge research. This provides additional opportunities for student-faculty collaborations, placements, industry interaction, and skill development. These initiatives offer a competitive edge to students pursuing higher studies in regions where NEP 2020 has been implemented.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) is an innovative virtual repository that empowers students with the ability to deposit, transfer, and redeem credits, enabling multiple entry and exit

points in their educational journey. This system provides students with the flexibility to transit between different disciplinary areas of study by acquiring the necessary credits in their chosen fields. Moreover, it facilitates seamless mobility between institutions, allowing students to pursue interdisciplinary learning experiences. The college acknowledges the significance of this concept and wholeheartedly commits to its implementation. The ABC framework embraces a blend of traditional classroom instruction and online teaching methodologies, accommodating alternative modes of learning. To facilitate the ABC system, the college encourages students to create their ABC IDs by logging into DigiLocker. This forward-thinking approach promotes a dynamic and adaptable education system that empowers students to shape their academic paths according to their interests and aspirations.

17.Skill development:

The college places a strong emphasis on skill-based courses aimed at equipping students with the essential competencies needed for their future pursuits. The college offers a diverse range of add-on courses, including foreign language, digital marketing, advance excel, web designing and Python programming. These courses provide students with practical skills and knowledge beyond their academic curriculum, empowering them to navigate the challenges of the everevolving job market. In addition to in-house offerings, the college has strong partnerships with external organizations through Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs), enabling students to benefit from hands-on training and industry exposure. The Placement Cell plays a pivotal role in organizing capacity building programs, career guidance sessions, campus drives, mock interviews, group discussions, and the college actively encourages students to pursue internships, engage in fieldwork and industrial visits, and participate in project-based learning experiences, promoting their experiential learning and skill development. This initiative aims not only to elevate students' competitiveness within the job market but also to strategically position them for advanced educational prospects, particularly in areas where the National Education Policy (NEP) has been put into effect.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The college actively promotes the integration of the Indian knowledge system by incorporating various initiatives. The college, affiliated to Himachal Pradesh University highlights the importance of the Indian Knowledge System through English language and literature for postgraduate courses. It is also highlighted in

compulsory courses of Hindi language and literature for undergraduate students in the Humanities and Commerce streams during their first and second year of study. Through a range of elective and generic courses, students are educated on ethics, gender equality, human values, and environmental awareness. The college encourages linguistic diversity by organizing events to celebrate Hindi and Matrabhasha Diwas, while various societies and clubs promote cultural, regional, and communal diversity through organized activities. The college promotes IKS by celebrating International Yoga Week enhancing physical and mental well-being among the students. The Heritage Club celebrates India's rich culture and heritage during Heritage Week, and the EK Bharat Shrestha Bharat Club promotes communal harmony through collaborations with the state By conducting such activities centered around the Indian Knowledge System it develops a deep appreciation of India's rich cultural, linguistic, and intellectual heritage among students. By integrating IKS into academic, co-curricular activities and celebrating different festivals the college creates an environment that not only celebrates diversity but also instills a sense of pride in India's traditions and values.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

St. Bede's College places a strong emphasis on Outcome Based Education (OBE) in all undergraduate and postgraduate programs in the fields of Humanities, Science, and Commerce, following the guidelines set by Himachal Pradesh University. The college has successfully implemented the OBE framework, which includes Program Outcomes (POs), Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs), and Course Outcomes (COs). During the induction programs, students are familiarized with the concept of outcome-based education, and they are provided with a clear understanding of the PSOs and COs before the start of their courses. This approach allows students to assess their learning at different cognitive levels, ranging from remembering and understanding to applying, analyzing, evaluating, and creating. The college employs various mechanisms to measure the achievement of POs and COs, including performance in internal assessments, mid-term and end-term exams, participation in extracurricular activities, academic progression to renowned institutions, internships, placements, and feedback from stakeholders. Through this comprehensive assessment process, the college ensures that students acquire the desired outcomes and develop the necessary competencies in their chosen fields of study. All co-curricular activities conducted in the college are outcome based.

20.Distance education/online education:

The college has opted for an online learning management system, with MS Teams serving as the primary platform for formal and distance education. Students have personalized logins, granting them access to virtual teachers, e-content, and a wide range of collegiate activities. The college's library offers online public access catalogues, providing students and faculty with an extensive collection of e-books and journals. Blended learning, a requirement of the NEP, has been effectively implemented, incorporating add-on courses in the curriculum. Staff members attend training and development programs through online platforms. Additionally, webinars and online conferences are organized to address contemporary topics of relevance to staff and students, facilitating distance education. Admissions, fee payments, examination form submissions, attendance tracking, co-curricular activity registrations, and alumnae registrations are efficiently managed online through an ERP system, promoting transparency and accountability. Communication among stakeholders is enhanced through the use of online teaching tools, SMS, and email, allowing everyone to stay connected and engaged with college activities.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation		

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

In alignment with Himachal Pradesh University's guidelines, St. Bede's College follows a comprehensive approach towards curriculum planning, delivery and continuous internal evaluation. Collaborative efforts with IQAC, Academic Monitors, HODs and Conveners of various Societies and Clubs result in a well-structured academic calendar.

Departmental meetings are regularly held to plan curricular, cocurricular and extra- curricular activities, apart from what students learn from the classroom environment, thus, ensuring successful implementation of the curriculum.

Curriculum delivery emphasizes on a student-centric approach, encouraging active learning through presentations, seminars, internships, guest lectures, field visits and various competitions. Diverse teaching techniques such as lectures, smart classrooms, virtual classes and audio-visual aids form part of the different learning styles. Students who require additional assistance are also provided with remedial classes. Additionally, the college offers addon and certificate courses to enhance students' knowledge and skills.

Fair continuous internal evaluation is conducted through transparent internal assessments, effective communication of assessment patterns and timely completion of evaluations are prioritized. The college conducts midterm exams and the date sheet for the same is shared with the students well in time. The student's feedback is taken for curriculum improvement. Academic audits and research initiatives are conducted regularly to maintain quality standards.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

The academic calendar encompasses Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE), which is strictly adhered to by the College. Students are assessed on three main criteria - Diagnostic Assessment: Induction

programmes are conducted at the beginning of every academic session wherein students are made familiar to the college environment. Orientation programmes by departments are held to introduce students to the syllabus and other relevant information. Bridging classes support students transitioning to a new study stream and adapt to undergraduate learning. Remedial classes provide extra support for students needing additional attention. Formative Assessment: Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) contributes 30 marks, with internal assessment conducted by each department through class tests, assignments, presentations, quizzes, and more. An additional 5 marks are awarded for regular attendance. Midterm exams are also a part of CCA and the timetable is published in advance to facilitate smooth academic planning and execution. To promote holistic development and experiential learning, students are encouraged to actively engage in co-curricular and extracurricular activities such as guest lectures, field visits, seminars, webinars, inter-college events, extension activities, educational tours and sports. SummativeAssessment - After scoring under the CIE, students are given relevant guidance to give their final examinations conducted by the Himachal Pradesh University, based on 70 marks.

Regular assessments, doubt-clearing sessions, and periodic written assignments further enhance their skills. A language laboratory is available to help improve their communication abilities. Mentors play a crucial role in motivating these students and involving them in extracurricular and departmental activities. Ongoing support is reinforced through regular Parent-Teacher Meetings. Advanced learners are encouraged to engage in research, editorial work, and internships. They participate in placement drives, represent the college at seminars, webinars, and workshops, and compete in inter college competitions. Leadership skills are fostered through elections and active participation in various cells and societies. These students are encouraged to explore beyond the syllabus and use e-platforms for conceptual and research development. Certificates and trophies are awarded to the subject toppers during the Annual Prize Distribution Day, inspiring advanced learners to excel further.

Language teachers use Digital Linguistic Mentor software to boost engagement and improve language acquisition, making the teaching-learning process more effective. ZEISS microscopy software enables precise visualization of cellular structures, enhancing students' understanding of cell types. ChemSketch software facilitates interactive 3D visualizations of molecular structures, improving comprehension of spatial arrangements in chemistry. PowerPoint presentations refine lecture delivery by highlighting key points, while MS Access and spreadsheets help organize, analyze, and manage data effectively. The college employs web-based tools like GNU plot and offers training in Python, JavaScript, HTML, C, C++, ASP.NET, Photoshop, and SPSS, equipping students with essential technical skills for future careers. E-resources, supported by the college's digital infrastructure, including projectors, Interactive Panels, and printers, enhance research and learning. 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The college Examination Committee ensures transparency and fairness in internal assessment. Students are informed about assessment methods and components during their orientation in the beginning of session. The committee actively monitors the university portal, sharing important updates with students via SMS and WhatsApp. Assessment parameters such as projects, group discussions, quizzes, assignments, role play are determined by the HODs during lesson planning. For mid-term tests, the examination committee coordinates with Academic Monitors to schedule timetable for mid-term tests. The Heads of Departments are required to submit question papers to the designated committee and the finalized schedule is prominently posted on notice boards for students and faculty. During mid-term tests, faculty members are assigned rooms for invigilation, and student attendance is recorded. After examinations, scripts are submitted to the committee for distribution to evaluators which are returned to the students for performance review after correction. Then, the CCA marks are uploaded to the university portal. Attendance concessions are provided to students involved in activities, and retests are conducted for those who miss examinations due to illness or other valid reasons. Students can also request revaluation of their assessments, and issues related to out-of-syllabus questions in final examination or scheduling conflicts to the university for resolution.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

The student grievance redressal cell provides a grievance form on the website for students to submit their complaints. Once received, the application is forwarded to the relevant teacher for review, and grievances are addressed within 15 days through the online portal. The Examination Committee, in association with the Student Grievance Redressal Cell (SGRC), handles issues related to internal examinations. If the internal committee cannot resolve the matter, it is presented to the Principal for resolution which is properly documented. In collaboration with academic coordinators and Heads of Departments, the committee prepares and shares detailed exam schedules with students, allowing ample time for preparation. Any scheduling conflicts are addressed within 24 hours, and the datesheets are updated. After grading, students can review their answer sheets and seek clarification from their teachers or HoD. If issues remain unresolved, they may escalate them to the student grievance cell. Retests are available for students who miss exams, with attendance concessions granted for illness or participation in college activities. For the resolution of mid-term examination grievances, teachers provide full assistance. Issues pertaining to out-of-syllabus questions or exam schedule conflicts during end-term exams are handled by the principal, who communicates with the university to find solutions.

A self-designed method transforms wastepaper into craft paper, used for event invites and student projects like diaries and bookmarks, with plans to sell these products to promote awareness. The college offers a Financial Lab cum Incubation Centre for entrepreneurship and employability skills. College offers music facilities with a variety of musical instruments. The students use a language lab to hone their communication skills and for learning new languages. Seminar hall, one classroom and Financial Lab cum Incubation Centre are equipped with Interactive Panels and advanced audiovisual systems. Individual faculty rooms and laptops are provided to each department for academic and research purpose. There are 184 desktops systems, 34 laptops, 6 smart classes, 15 projectors, 22 printers cum scanners and 5 photocopy machines to enhance operational efficiency. A wellstocked library has a comfortable reading area, access to a multitude of e-books and e-journals, facilitated through INFLIBNET and N-list, students are availing the facility for their research projects and academic purpose. The library also houses a digital resource centre with computers, printers, reprography, and scanning facilities, and offers a book bank service for students. The archive section has rare books and digital posters depicting the history of the college from the time of its establishment. The hostel accommodates 200 residential students with excellent facilities. Generators and UPS is available for continuous power supply.
