

The Beginnings of Congregations of Jesus & Mary

Claudine Thevenet was born in Lyon when the French Revolution unleashed a reign of terror, soaking the city of Lyon in bloodshed. True to her Catholic education, she was comforting, consoling and providing for the starving and wounded soldiers of both armies. However, providence had other designs for her. At the tender age of 19, she had the misfortune of witnessing the brutal execution of her two younger brothers, which had an imprint on her heart, not the horrifying execution, but the last words of her dying brothers-'Forgive, Claudine, as we forgive'. These beautiful words were an echo of words uttered by Jesus Christ from the cross.



Claudine now chose to fulfill the dying request of her younger brothers, such was the hard school in which the future foundress was initiated; and it was here the foundations of a biding faith in ever-living providence, utter selflessness, Christ like charity and sympathy with others, were laid. Her life was now for the poor and needy of every category and the outcasts of society. Fr. Andre Coindre was a constant guide to Claudine. The day 31st July, 1816 saw the association of young ladies in Lyon in honour of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. After two years of Christian charity, on 31st July 1818, there was a Divine Call, 'Come Follow me', words spoken so long ago on the shores of Galilee, now re-echoed in her heart and Claudine resolved to leave her home. Thus, on that day was conceived the ideal which is the aim of the Congregation of Jesus & Mary 'to form souls for heaven by means of a truly Christian education'. Her method of imparting education was simple: 'prevent faults' she would say, and the deviations of the pupils by vigilance, so that you will not have to punish them. The best leader is not the one who punishes, but the one who knows how to prevent the greatest number of mistakes. In 1818 while forming the religious order of young ladies Claudine took the name of Mary St. Ignatius- the Patron Saint of Ignatius of Loyalla. Mother Mary St. Ignatius devoted herself completely to her Congregation. The numerous trials she met and overcame, strengthened her soul but undermined her bodily strength and on 3rd February, 1837 she breathed her last. Her dying words, 'How Good God Is' are a testimony to the work of the Jesus & Mary Congregation, how it started and where it has reached today. 'One woman, one orphan, one loom'-surely a humble beginning, yet from such a tiny mustard seed has blossomed a giant tree whose branches have spread far and wide embracing all nations, races and cultures.

St. Bede- The Patron Saint of St. Bede's College



St. Bede

St. Bede was probably born in 673 A.D. At the age of seven, his parents placed him under the care of Abbot Benedict for his education and upbringing. But when the monastery of St. Paul was established in the year 682, St. Bede seems to have been transferred to the care of its first Abbot, Ceolfrid, and to have remained a monk there for the remainder of his life.

St. Bede was made a deacon at the age of nineteen by Bishop John of Hexham. Since canon law laid down the age of twenty-five as the norm for admission to the diaconate, Bede's scholarship and devotion must have been recognised as exceptional for him to have been presented by Abbot Ceolfrid six years early. He was advanced to the Priesthood by Bishop John eleven years later. From the time of his receiving the priesthood until his fifty-ninth year, he worked to compile extracts from the works of the venerable Fathers on holy scripture, and to make commentaries on their meaning and interpretation. During all this, St. Bede was gathering materials for his History which he completed in 731.

St. Bede's History belongs to his latter years, due to which he has richly earned the title 'Father of English History'. For St. Bede was not content to compile a bare chronicle of events and dates, or to restrict himself to biography as his predecessors had done. He set himself to examine all available records, to secure verbal or written accounts from reliable living authorities, to record local traditions and stories, to interpret significant events, and in short, to compile as complete and continuous a history of the English Church and people as lay within his power. He was the first to conceive or attempt such a formidable project and posterity acknowledges his pioneer work as a remarkably successful achievement. St. Bede's industry and scholarship are generally acknowledged, but his most significant achievement lies in his inspired ability to select and integrate the vast mass of facts and traditions that he had gathered, into a single framework. When we consider St. Bede's limited facilities and resources, it is clear that his achievements are unique.

St. Bede passed away on the evening of 25th May, 735 A.D. The principal and lasting memorial of the first of the English historians is the inspiration of his holy life and the value of the great work that he bequeathed to posterity.

Instructions for Students/ Parents/ Guardians

- Students/Parents/Guardians should acquaint themselves thoroughly with the following rules :
- a) The admission form should be complete in all respects in legible, block letters and submitted along with the relevant certificates.
- b) A student will not be admitted to class unless she produces the admission slip duly attested by the Principal.
- c) Fees is to be paid through online mode.
- d) Non-payment of fees for 2 months may cause a student's name to be struck off the rolls of the institution. If the student is readmitted, admission fee will be charged again.
- e) Lectures attended by a student whose name is struck off the rolls, on account of non-payment of fees, will not be counted for the period she is off the rolls.
- f) Use of mobile phones in the classrooms is strictly prohibited.
- g) Students are expected to attend their classes regularly. The university rules require a student to have a minimum of 75% attendance, failing which the student will not be permitted to sit for the university examinations.
- h) Names of the students absent without informing for more than ten consecutive classes will be struck off the rolls. Re-admission may be granted at the discretion of the Principal and readmission fees of Rs. 50 will be charged.



Anti-Ragging Cell

Ragging is Strictly Banned in the Institution

The college has constituted an Anti-Ragging Cell in accordance with the rules and regulations set forth by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.


Ragging is a criminal conspiracy, unlawful assembly and rioting. Public nuisance is created during ragging. There is violation of decency and morals through ragging, injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt, wrongful restraint, wrongful confinement, use of criminal force, assault as well as sexual offences or even unnatural offences, extortion, criminal trespass, criminal intimidation and attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim shall not be tolerated by the college.



The following could be the possible penalty for those who are found guilty of participation in/or abetment of ragging. The quantum of punishment shall, naturally, depend upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Disciplinary Committee or the Court of Law.

Rules against Ragging:

- 1. Cancellation of admission.
- 2. Suspension from attending classes, as decided by the committee.
- 3. Withholding, withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and any other benefits.
- 4. Debarring from appearing in any test, examination or any other evaluation process.
- 5. Withholding results.
- 6. Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- 7. Suspension or expulsion from the hostel and the college and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
- 8. Fine up to Rs. 25,000/-
- 9. Rigorous imprisonment up to three years.
- 10. All students to fill online anti-ragging form on www.antiragging.in and send the scanned copy to the college along with other admission documents.

Objective

To provide opportunities for Redressal of certain grievances of students already enrolled in any institution, as well as those seeking admission to such institutions, and a mechanism thereto.

Mechanism Of Student Grievance Redressal

"Grievance" means, and includes, complaint(s) made by an aggrieved student. Any aggrieved student may submit an application seeking redressal of grievance. On receipt of complaint, the institution shall refer the complaint to the Students' Grievance Redressal Committee, along with its comments within 15 days of receipt of complaint on the online portal. The Students' Grievance Redressal Committee, as the case may be, shall fix a date for hearing the complaint which shall be communicated to the institution and the aggrieved student.

Students Services Centre (ssc)

Eligibility Criteria for Admission

A pass in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) from a recognised board.

- (i) A minimum percentage of marks required for the B.A. & B.Com. programme shall be 45% and 40% for SC/ST/OBC in the previous qualifying examination.*
- (ii) A minimum percentage of marks required for admission to B.Sc. programme shall be 50% and 45% for SC/ST/OBC in the previous qualifying examination.*
- * The minimum percentage can vary according to Himachal Pradesh University regulation/declaration.
- (iii) The candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream, shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc./B.C.A. programme.
- (iv) The candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream, shall be given preference in admission to B.Com./B.B.A. programme.
- (v) The candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Mathematics as one of the subjects, shall be given preference in admission to B.C.A. programme.

Students with compartment in 10+2 examination will not be eligible for admission in the college.

Outline of Choice Based Credit System:

- 1. Core Course: (14 for honours courses; 4 discipline specific papers, each for regular courses and 2 papers each for English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com): The papers under this category are going to be taught uniformly across all universities with 30% deviation proposed in the draft. The purpose of fixing core papers is to ensure that all the institutions follow a minimum common curriculum so that each institution/university adheres to common minimum standard. Also the course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline. A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core Course.
- 2. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

- 2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: (4 for honours courses and 2 each for 5 regular courses): Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.
- 2.2 Generic Elective (GE) Course: (4 for honours courses and 2 each for B.A./B.Com./ regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers.
- 3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE)
 Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)
 and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC. AECC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement;
 - i.) Environmental Science
 - ii.) English/ Hindi/ MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.
- 3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/Hindi Communication/MIL Communication.
- 3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses: (SEC) (minimum 2 for honours courses and 4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training in field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.
- 3.3 Practical/tutorials : One each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper.
- 4. Dissertation/Project: To introduce a research component in under graduate courses Project work/Dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/ analyzing/exploring a real life situation/ difficult problem. A Project/Dissertation work would be of 6 credits. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

Award of Degree

- 1. An undergraduate degree with Honours in a discipline may be awarded if a student completes 14 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 4 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective and Generic Elective papers, respectively.
- 2. An undergraduate degree in Science disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.
- 3. An Undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice, 2 core papers each in English and Hindi/MIL, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two papers from the list of Generic Elective papers.

Course-wise Assessment and Evaluation

All courses involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:

- (i) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade that student gets in a course.
- (ii) End-Semester Examination (ESE) accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.
- (iii) For practical subjects theory will be 50%, Practical 20% and CCA 30%

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) : This would have the following components :

Classroom Attendance:-Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/Tutorials/Practicals. A student having less that 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End-Semester Examination (ESE).

- * Those having between 74% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the Principal.
- * Those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the head of the institution.
- * The exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in prescribed co-curricular activities (e.g. NCC, NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports etc.) to the extent of 25%. However, the condition of 50% attendance will be compulsory in these cases. The claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned authorities.
- * The candidates getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for cocurricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below.
- A) Classroom Attendance Incentive:

As an incentive for the classroom attendance. CCA marks will be awarded as follows:-

> 75% but < 80% 1 mark
> 80% but < 85% 2 marks
> 85% but < 90% 3 marks
> 90% but < 95% 4 marks
> 95% 5 marks
```

B) Minor Test :

There will be one minor test of 15 marks.

C) Internal Assessment:

Remaining 10 marks of CCA will be awarded on the basis of Seminars/Assignment/Class tests etc

Note: In order to qualify a paper students must pass both in CCA and ESE separately.

A student failing in CCA will not be permitted to take her End Semester Exam (as per HPU Rules).

Grievance and Redressal Mechanism

The students will have the right to make an appeal against any component of evaluation. Such appeal has to be made to the Principal of the college on a prescribed form and should clearly state in writing the reason(s) for the complaint/appeal. The appeal will be placed before Student Grievance Redressal Committee (SGRC) chaired by the college Principal.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admission and Reservation

Admission to the various courses of study shall be open to all girls, irrespective of race, creed, caste or class. However, Christian students who qualify, will be given preference for admission. As per Government norms 25% of seats are reserved for SC/ST/OBC/PWD.

- a) 22% of the seats shall be reserved for SC/ST/OBC candidates.
- b) 3% seats shall be reserved for physically challenged candidates
- c) 5% seats shall be reserved for students who are outstanding in sports (National/International rank-holders).

All students applying for admission under the Reserved Category (SC/ST/OBC/Minorities) must furnish related certificates. It is mandatory to submit the same as it is required for use by the UGC, government departments, NAAC and other official agencies which the college deals with for providing benefits to those students.

Refusal of Admission

- ★ No student shall be eligible for admission to first semester, if she is more than 25 years of age as on 1st June of the relevant year of admission. This age limit shall be raised up to 3 years for Scheduled Caste/Tribe candidates. The ViceChancellor may, however, in exceptional ci rcumstances, to be recorded in writing, permit relaxation in age up to a maximum period of three months.
- *No student who fails in all the compulsory and elective subjects or fails twice in the same examination conducted on the annual system shall be readmitted in the same class. The Vice -Chancellor of the University may in exceptional circumstances, for reasons to be recorded in writing, permit such a student to be admitted not withstanding anything contained in the foregoing rules. A student shall be refused admission if her conduct during any previous stay in the College has been unsatisfactory. A student who has been expelled or rusticated shall not be admitted to any course of study in the College without the prior approval of the Vice Chancellor of the University. This approval is obtained by the Principal of the College.
- ★In cases not governed by the above, the Principal reserves the right to refuse the admission without assigning any reason.
- ★ The admission of a candidate migrating from a Board/University/College shall be treated as provisional and shall only be confirmed when she produces :

- (i) The original certificate of the previous qualifying examination, along with three attested photostat copies of the same certificate.
- (ii) A certificate of good conduct from the head of the institution last attended by her.
- (iii) An original migration certificate in the case of applicants who have passed examinations from Board/Universities other than the H. P. Board or the Himachal Pradesh University.
- (iv) A medical certificate of fitness. (Form attached)
- (v) 'No Objection Certificate', from the Indian Embassy abroad and student visa (Foreign students only).
- (vi) Equivalence certificate from H. P. University (Foreign students only).

A student disqualified by another University shall not be given admission during the period of disqualification.

Migration

The admission of students migrating from another University or from another college or institution affiliated to the Himachal Pradesh University shall be governed by Regulations framed by the Executive Council of the Himachal Pradesh University in this behalf, from time to time.

Certificate Course in Self Defence

St. Bede's College proudly introduces STRIKE, a scientifically designed and government-approved self-defense program created in collaboration with the Sector Skill Council. STRIKE is specifically tailored to empower girls, equipping them with the skills necessary to protect themselves in real-life situations such as sexual assaults, kidnapping, molestation, groping, and bullying. The primary objective of this program is to train participants to effectively respond to and counter any form of assault or harassment, allowing them to navigate the world with confidence and freedom.

D. El. Ed. Course

The D. El. Ed. Course is of two years duration and is termed as Diploma in Elementary Education. It is affiliated to the H. P. Board. Minimum qualification for admission to the course is at least 50% marks in 10+2 for the candidates of general category and 45% for the candidates belonging to SC and ST categories, after which they go through the D. El. Ed. Common Entrance Test. Successful candidates are allotted seats to the Training Colleges through Counselling held every year by the H. P. Board.

Curriculum Structure

The content of the D. El. Ed. programme has the potential to prepare the trainees to handle effectively the elementary school curriculum from standard I to VIII. The major function of the course is to enable the prospective teachers to develop insight into priorities and problems of learning processes and to equip the trainees to organise teaching learning process in schools with the right perspective.

School Experience Programmes

Practice Teaching is undertaken by the D. El. Ed. students in different government schools every year during their two year course.

There is an annual examination in the month and dates notified by the H.P. Board.

ELIGIBILITY FOR EXAMINATION

- ★ In order to be eligible to appear at the University examination, the candidate should have attended not less than:
 - (a) 75% of the lectures delivered in each of the subjects offered.
 - (b) 25% of the periods are assigned to practical work in each subject.
 - (c) The student should qualify the Mid-term examinations which are compulsory.
 - d) Parents too are responsible for ensuring the minimum percentage of attendance (75%) required to sit for the final examination.
- ★ Absence from lectures, tutorials, seminars, practicals etc., on account of participation in Institution Inter-college, State, National, International Meets or tournaments, Youth Festival and Cultural competitions or N.C.C. or N.S.S. camps, including the actual time spent on journeys therefore, shall be ignored and shall be deemed as attendance for the purpose of the above.

Admission to Examinations:

- ★ The Himachal Pradesh University from time to time prescribes the forms and certificates required for admission to the different examinations of the University and makes the forms available online. A candidate seeking admission to an examination of the Himachal Pradesh University shall be required to pay the fees as prescribed by the same University.
- ★ The Principal of the College may intimate the candidates, at least fifteen days prior to the commencement of the examination, for the withdrawal of the application of any candidate, who fails to fulfil the conditions.
- ★ The Superintendent of the Examination centre may not permit a candidate to take the examination, if it is brought to his/her notice in writing by the Principal of the College that the candidate has not paid the outstanding dues including hostel and mess charges or has failed to return the library books or

other articles, or in the case of loss, has not paid the cost thereof, as assessed by the Principal of the College.

★ The Vice Chancellor of the University may withdraw the permission of the candidate to appear in an examination, if at any stage it is found that the candidate was not eligible for admission to that examination or has been subsequently rusticated or expelled from the College after the submission of her application form.

Withdrawal Policy

A student who wishes to withdraw her admission from the college must apply to the Principal in writing. The application for withdrawal must be countersigned by the parent. All fees, fines and other dues will be charged when the formal withdrawal takes place.

Fee Refund Policy

College refund policy is in accordance with UGC Guidelines.

- * If a student chooses to withdraw from a program of study in which she is enrolled, the institution concerned shall follow the following fourtier system for the refund of fee remitted by the Student.
 - (inclusive of course fee and non tuition fee but exclusive of caution money and security deposit)

Sr. No.	Percentage of Refund of Aggregate Fee	Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is served to HEI
(1)	100%	15 days before the formally notified last date of admission
(2)	80%	Not more than 15 days after the formally notified last date of admission
(3)	50%	More than 15 days but less than 30 days after formally notified last date of admission
(4)	00%	More than 30 days after formally notified last date of admission

- * Incase of (1) in the table above, the HEI concerned shall deduct an amount not more that 10% of the aggregate Fee as processing charges from the refund amount.
- * Fee shall be refunded to the eligible student after one month of the date of receiving a written application form her in this regard.

Removal from College

The Principal has the discretion to strike off the name of any student who is irregular in attendance or is not amenable to the college discipline.

Each student must bear the cost of repairing and replacing all articles of furniture, crockery, library books etc. lost, broken and damaged by her.

Scholarships & Financial Assistance Scholarships

There are number of scholarship opportunities available for students. The college management may grant fee concession to the needy students having financial difficulty in continuing with their studies on merit-cum-means basis. These scholarships recognize merit and talent of students. Students may submit their application/form for the scholarship at the beginning of the academic session, within 20 days of registration for admission.

Fee Concession Policy

For first year students enrolling with the score of 90% or higher in 10+2, will be eligible for a scholarship, entitling them to a 10% wavier on tuition fees (applicable for self-financing courses)

- (i) The students interested in availing fee concession must submit their application/form along with requisite documents/certificates such as:
- (ii) An affidavit with respect to the family income (income certificate from Tehsildar with details of income from different sources).
- (iii) Academic profile of the previous class in the principal's office within 20 days of their registration for timely processing of the application for fee concession.
- (iv) Fee concession to students whose parents are not surviving and there is no source of income and those whose father has expired, and mother is not able to bear the expenditure towards studies. Following documents/Information shall

- be submitted by the student: 1. Proof of Death be submitted by the candidate. 2. Income proof/certificate from the tehsildar.
- (v) The students must have passed the examination in first attempt i.e., should not have a re-appear or compartment or should not have dropped the examination. In case of gap of one year or more between passing the qualifying exam & seeking admission in the college, this discount will not be granted.
- (vi) Students should not involve in criminal cases, ragging or any other misconduct/violation of College Rules. Students must attain the minimum percentage of attendance as prescribed by the University in the current year i.e. not less than 90%.
- (vii) Not getting any fellowship/scholarship/concession from any other source.

 The concession may be withdrawn on misconduct/indiscipline on the part of the student, irregularity in attendance or failure or unsatisfactory grade in any of the courses in any examination.

General conditions applicable to all category of students availing fee concession (i) Fee concession is not a matter of right of the student and the college can increase or decrease percent of students to be granted fee concession, extent of fee concession, amount of fee concession, limit of income of their parents/guardian to be eligible for fee concession or any other condition.

Student's Aid Fund (SAF)

Students can avail of financial assistance offered by the SAF, application for the same to be given to the principal.

LEAVE RULES

- ★ Students are expected to attend their classes regularly.
- * They are expected to attend punctually all the examinations and tests of various types in the subjects they study. The parents and students will hold responsibility to abide by the university requirements.
- In case student is taking medical leave, she should submit a leave application to the college office, which must be countersigned by Parent/Guaridan/Hostel Superintendent/Teacher.

 Additionally on returning to classes, the student is required to provide a medical
 - Additionally, on returning to classes, the student is required to provide a medical certificate along with the medical fitness certificate.
- Students, even if they are on leave, must see to it that their fees are paid and that the library books they have borrowed are returned on time.

ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES

- ★ Applications for Character and Transfer Certificates should be made at least two days in advance.
- ★ Before a Character Certificate is issued, teachers teaching the student and the Mentor should fill the Mentor Card, which will also be submitted along with the application.
- ★ A duplicate copy of any certificate will be issued on payment of Rs. 50/ if it is within one year or Rs. 100/, if later.
- ★ For obtaining the degree certificate by post, the Ex-Students are requested to pay Rs. 500/ (Postage included) for students residing in India. For overseas students a sum of Rs. 700/- (Postage included) must be sent in the form of DD in the name of St. Bede's Educational Society
- ★ When transcripts or photocopies of the syllabus are required a fee of Rs. 500/must be paid in the form of DD in the name of St. Bede's Educational Society

LIBRARY FACILITIES

- ★ The library is open from 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. on all working days.
- ★ The college provides excellent Library and reading room facilities. The total number of volumes on the shelves exceeds 35,780 with more than 80 periodicals.
- ★ The library has an archive section which has more than 2,500 Ancient and Rare Books.
- ★ The college is proud to have an automated two floor library. The students and staff have access to National Library and Information Services Infrastructure of Scholarly Content through INFLIBNET.
- **★** The library provides internet and photostat facility to the staff and students.
- ★ The library is operated on the 'Open stack' principle that permits direct access to the books. The books are classified according to the Dewy System and arranged in Decimal Classification System and in decimal sequences. A book once drawn from a shelf is to be replaced to its previous position.

LIBRARY RULES

- ★ The library is essentially a place of quiet and serious study. Silence is to be maintained at all times inside and outside the library.
- ★ A student can borrow three books at a time against the Identitycum-library Card. Post graduate students may borrow four books at a time. The books may be retained for a period of seven days, after which they must be returned. At the time of returning the books, the Librarian may decide whether to reissue the book or not. A fine of Re. I/- per volume, per day will be charged for the books kept over time.
- ★ Leave from the college does not imply exemption from the return of books. The books may be returned to the Library through a messenger or by registered post.
- ★ Students will keep their personal belongings at the property counter at their own risk. Students may however, take into the library, note books and essential stationery.
- ★ Before leaving the library, students must ensure that they have returned all the reading material used by them. They are strictly forbidden to take away any book which is not issued to them. At the exit counter, books issued will be examined.
- ★ Book Bank text books will be issued every Tuesday and Friday from 2.00 pm to 3.00 pm. The needy students have to deposit Rs. 100/per book as security.
